Route 29 (Gravel Pike) Travel Restrictions Begin Next Week for Intersection Improvement Project in Montgomery County

King of Prussia, PA – Route 29 (Gravel Pike) will be reduced to a single lane between Miller Road and Harrison Road on Monday, April 9, through early June, for excavation and grading operations as part of a project to improve travel and safety at the intersections of Route 29 (Gravel Pike) at Plank Road/Otts Road; Route 73 (Skippack Pike) at Plank Road; and Meyers Road, Seitz Road and Township Line Road in Skippack, Perkiomen and Limerick townships, Montgomery County, the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT) announced today. Traffic will be controlled by a temporary signal.

Motorists are advised to allow extra time when traveling through the construction areas because backups and slowdowns will occur.

Improvements under this \$11.3 million project include widening the intersection of Route 73 (Skippack Pike) and Plank Road to include left turn lanes on both roads; relocating Otts Road to align with Plank Road at Route 29 (Gravel Pike) to create a four-leg intersection; adding left turn lanes on Route 29 (Gravel Pike) at Plank Road/Otts Road; adding left turn lanes on Plank Road and Otts Road at Route 29 (Gravel Pike); realigning Meyers Road to intersect with Township Line Road; realigning Seitz Road to form a T-intersection with Meyers Road; installing new traffic signals along the project corridor; and improving the roadway alignment in three locations.
